## **NURSE PRACTITIONER**

For decades the leading nursing theorists, are trying to find a satisfactory definition of this profession. The basic question is whether it is - and if so, why nursing specific in relation to other healthcare professions; on its own theoretical basis or only by the methods of applying a single theoretical foundation that links all other medical vocations? Only in recent times, from Florence Nightingale to the present day, the need for a certain vocational training of caregivers or nurses was imposed. Those who are engaged in it, often as motto quote her sentence as follows: "It is often said that each a woman can be a good nurse. I, on the other hand, consider that the basic elements of the health condition require knowledge". With the latest, little tendency of extending the nursing profession in the profession, the question of the specificity of nursing and their education in relation to other parental professions is opened.
